Note: due to the special scheduling required for students in this dual-degree, in which there is an academic year that requires 5.5 CUs in one semester and 4.5 CUs in the other semester, no additional tuition charges are assessed for the 10 academic year CUs needed in this situation. However, students who choose to take more than 10 CUs in the academic year will be subject to Weitzman's regular overload tuition policies.
