The minor in Russian and East European Studies (6 c.u.) provides a flexible, interdisciplinary approach to the study of Russia, Central and Eastern Europe, Central Asia and the Caucasus, and the Balkan and Baltic regions. Students gain both linguistic and cultural proficiency through coursework in the humanities and social sciences, drawing on the department's broad regional expertise. The REES minor encourages exploration across disciplines and is well suited to students seeking to deepen their academic interests through focused regional knowledge and language study.
